Privacy Statement

We may also require:

- National Insurance Number
- Ethnicity information
- Health and Disability Information
- Financial Information

What do we use personal data for?

We collect personal data to enable us, if appropriate, to identify you and to provide a suitable service, and for the purposes of statistical analysis.

The information is used in practice and for system administration purposes and to form personalised profiles and demographics that we may use to improve the content of our

communications to you. In order to collect customer use profiles, we may use "cookies" to store and track information about your use of KFMS.

Cookies

Cookies are small pieces of information which may be sent from our website to your computer or mobile phone and which are stored on your device's hard drive. They are designed to enable users to access our site more effectively and help us assess how our site is used.

Many internet browsers (such as Internet Explorer, Firefox Mozilla or Google Chrome) give users options about cookies. Most browsers default setting allow cookies; our system will issue cookies when you log on to and use our site.

Google Analytics

This website uses Google Analytics to help analyse how users use the site.
